What is this product?

Type

The product is a share class of FTGF Franklin Responsible Income 2031 Fund (the "Fund") which is part of the Franklin Templeton Global Funds plc, an investment company with variable capital incorporated with limited liability in Ireland and established as an umbrella fund with segregated liability between sub-funds.

Term

2031 ("Maturity"). Before the Fund's Maturity, the Investment Manager will write to investors setting out the options available to them which may include, but are not limited to, the liquidation of the Fund, a switch or merger into Shares of other Funds of the Company or other UCITS of the Franklin Templeton group or a change of the investment objective and policy. Management company: Franklin Templeton International Services S.à r.l. is not entitled to terminate the fund unilaterally.

Objectives

Investment Objective

The Fund's goal is to generate income while seeking to preserve capital.

Investment Policy

The Fund mainly invests in corporate and government debt securities denominated in EUR. These investments may be from anywhere in the world, including, to a lesser extent, emerging markets. The investments may also be investment grade and below investment grade.

The Fund will pursue its investment objective and policy for a period of five years following its launch (the "Maturity Date").

In the period leading up to the Maturity Date in 2031 (the wind-down period), the Fund may gradually shift its investments to money market instruments and other cash-like assets.

Derivatives and techniques The Fund may use derivatives for reducing risks (hedging) and costs, and to generate additional income or growth (in accordance with the risk profile of the Fund).

Strategy The investment manager uses Fundamental analysis to identify issuers with a robust business model and credit profile, and select securities that appear to offer high real yields for their risk level.

SFDR category Article 8 (promotes environmental and/or social characteristics under EU regulations).

The investment manager applies a proprietary rating methodology using various ESG criteria to assess long-term opportunities and risks. The fund excludes issuers lagging in the transition to a low-carbon economy and excludes or restricts investments in certain industries that are harmful to the environment or society, such as thermal coal, weapons and tobacco.

For this share class all, or some portion of, net income is declared and paid monthly to shareholders.

Intended retail Investor

Investors who understand the risks of the Fund and plan to invest until the Fund's maturity date. The Fund may appeal to investors who:

- are willing to hold an investment until the Maturity Date
- are looking for income from an investment that seeks to preserve capital
- are interested in exposure to Euro denominated global bond markets as part of a diversified portfolio
- have a low to medium risk profile and can tolerate moderate short-term changes in the share price

Product availability The Fund will remain open for a limited period, after which it will be closed to new investors and will no longer accept additional investments from existing shareholders.

Terms to understand

bonds, below investment grade: Bonds represent an obligation to repay a debt, along with interest. Below investment grade bonds generally pay higher interest rates but are considered less likely to make all scheduled payments or repay the initial debt.

derivatives: Financial instruments whose value is linked to one or more rates, indexes, share prices or other values.

emerging markets: Markets of less economically developed nations, such as some nations in Asia, Africa, Eastern Europe and Latin America.

money market instruments: Financial instruments designed to provide stable value, interest, high liquidity and a very low risk of loss.



What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets.

What happens if Franklin Templeton International Services S.à r.l. is unable to pay out?

Franklin Templeton International Services S.à r.l. ("FTIS") is the management company of the Fund, but the assets are held separately from FTIS by the depositary. BNY Mellon SA/NV Dublin Branch, as the appointed depositary of the Fund, is liable to the Fund or its shareholders for any loss of financial instruments held in custody by it or its delegates (cash could however be lost in case of default of the depositary or its delegates).

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Fund's depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario
- EUR 10 000 is invested

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years following the Fund's launch/until 2031 ("Maturity").

This Fund has no minimum required holding period. We consider that the 5 year recommended holding period is appropriate because the Fund is designed for long-term investment. You may sell your shares on any dealing day. The value of your investments may go down as well as up irrespective of the period you are holding your investments, depending on such factors as the performance of the Fund, movements in stock and bond prices, and conditions in financial markets generally.
